



## Truck Access

- Is the driveway steep, windy or a sharp turn in from the road? Is the road access particularly narrow? A large truck with a container on board is not as maneuverable as your personal vehicle.
- For a roll off delivery, the truck needs 60 ft to deliver a 20 ft (or smaller) container or 120 ft to deliver a 40 ft container. Once the container is on the ground, he will need to drive away, so he cannot be wedged into a tight space.
- The truck will back the container into place. Do you want the doors of the container to sit against the cab of the truck or the back of the truck?
- For a crane delivery, the truck will need a firm, flat area to set up and stabilize. You should also consider how far the crane will need to reach to place the container.
- The truck may weigh as much as 45,000 lbs. The driver will refuse delivery if they feel the ground is not able to support the weight of the truck safely.
- Are there tree branches or overhead wires in the way? When the driver tilts the deck to unload the container it will be around 16 feet high. A crane cannot operate under tree branches or overhead wires.
- The truck is quite wide and they will need use of their mirrors when backing in. They will require a minimum of 12 feet in width. Is there landscaping, fencing or any other structures in the way?

## Where to place a container?

- Consider the season. Will the truck need to cross grass, mud or soft ground to place the container? If so, planning your purchase during the dry season is advisable.
- The container needs to sit on fairly level ground or the doors won't open and close well.
- The ground needs to be well drained or you may have moisture issues.
- It's recommended to put the container on some type of blocks to allow air flow underneath.
- If it's sitting under trees you will need to clear debris off the roof at least once a year.
